Senate Committee Nomination Process - Overview

- Senate Republicans use their Committee on Committees, relying on a seniority formula to make nominations.
- Senate Democrats use their Steering and Outreach Committee, making nominations on a seat-by-seat bases, considering a variety of factors.
- Nominations require the approval of pertinent full party conferences and ultimately the Senate.

Senate Appropriations Committee

Chair: Sen. Collins (R-ME)

Ranking Member: Sen. Murray (D-WA)

The Senate Appropriations Committee oversees all discretionary spending in the Senate. Sens. Collins (R-ME) and Murray (D-WA) will continue to serve as committee leadership, with Collins serving as Chair and Murray as Ranking Member in the 119th Congress. Collins' key priorities include funding biomedical research, infrastructure, rural economic development, education, job training and child care programs. We also expect the committee to support efforts of President's Trump's Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), which aims to reduce up to \$2 trillion in federal spending.

Senate Finance Committee

Chair: Sen. Crapo (R-ID)

Ranking Member: Sen. Wyden (D-OR)

The Senate Finance Committee has significant health authority with jurisdiction over Medicare and Medicaid. Incoming Chair Crapo (R-ID) has traditionally focused less on health care issues and, as such, the committee is likely to focus more on other areas of its jurisdiction, such as 2017 tax reform extensions. However, both Chair Crapo (R-ID) and Ranking Member Wyden (D-OR) have supported various bipartisan health care policies, including mental health and pharmacy benefit manager (PBM) oversight bills. Crapo (R-ID) may also pursue policies addressing the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) and reforms to Medicaid. Several prominent Democratic members and champions of health care issues are departing the committee.

The Senate HELP Committee has a significant focus on health care, overseeing public health issues with jurisdiction over FDA, CDC and NIH, as well public and private health insurance. Sens. Sanders (I-VT) and Cassidy (R-LA) will continue to serve in leadership, with Cassidy serving as committee chair and Sanders as Ranking Member. Chair Cassidy's health care priorities include health care workforce, reducing health care costs, value-based care, site neutral payments, and Medicare Advantage reform. It is expected that both Cassidy and Sanders will support aspects of President Trump's Make America Healthy Again (MAHA) agenda.

As a Special Committee, Senate Special Committee on Aging has the opportunity to examine topics on Medicare, Medicaid, Social Security, and older American policy issues. The committee had a large turnover from the previous session. Incoming Chair Rick Scott (R-FL) has relations with the health system industry and is expected to address aging concerns in that industry, while Ranking Member Gillibrand (D-NY) is a senior member of the Armed Service Committee and may focus on veterans aging issues. The committee also may consider reauthorizing the Older Americans Act (OAA).

Senate Agriculture Committee

The Senate Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry Committee oversees all matters relating to the agriculture industry and farming programs, as well as nutrition, home economics, and rural development. It is undergoing leadership changes in the 119th Congress, with Sen. Boozman (R-AR) assuming the role of Chair and Sen. Klobuchar (D-MN) serving as Ranking Member. This committee oversees critical areas such as farm policy, rural development, forestry, and nutrition programs such as SNAP and school meals. With the Farm Bill still awaiting reauthorization, the committee is anticipated to place urgency on addressing this legislative priority. Last Congress, Sen. Boozman unveiled a [framework](#) emphasizing a "farmer-focused farm bill," which we anticipate will inform his leadership priorities.

Cruz's key priorities include expanding access to wireless spectrum, applying a "light-touch" regulatory approach to artificial intelligence (AI), and providing oversight of "big tech." Sen. - Full party caucus or conference votes to approve nominations and a resolution is introduced and agreed to on the House floor, formally electing members to their assignments.

 - Rep. Kelly (D-IL) – Priorities include maternal health, heartland state issues
 - Rep. Barragan (D-CA) – Priorities include climate change

The House Agriculture Committee has general jurisdiction over federal agriculture policy and oversight of some federal agencies. Chair Thompson (R-PA) will continue as Chair, with Rep. Craig (D-MN) serving as the newly appointed Ranking Member. Both leaders have expressed strong commitments to bipartisan work and passing a comprehensive Farm Bill in the new Congress.

House Energy & Commerce Committee

The House Energy & Commerce Committee has significant health jurisdiction, overseeing telecommunications; food and drug safety; public health and research; and Medicare and Medicaid. Committee Chair Guthrie (R-KY) and Health Subcommittee Chair Carter (R-GA) have been active health policy leaders on the committee prior to their current roles. As Health Subcommittee Chair in the last Congress, Rep. Guthrie (R-KY) has extensive health policy experience. His policy priorities include Medicaid and PBM reform and site-neutral payments. We also expect the committee will focus on IRA oversight, improving drug and device supply chains, and increasing drug price transparency. The committee lost several members with significant health care expertise last session, including former Chair Rodgers (R-WA), former Health Subcommittee Ranking Member Eshoo (D-CA), and Reps. Burgess (R-TX), Buchson (R-IN), and Cárdenas (D-CA).

Health Subcommittee Chair Carter (R-GA) is expected to focus on PBM reform and pharmacy issues, telehealth, chronic care, and promoting patient choice. Rep. DeGette (D-CO) is expected to focus on passing Cures 2.1, new legislation that aims to address clinical trials for rare diseases and data access. In 2021, Rep. DeGette (D-CO) introduced Cures 2.0, which aimed to address pandemic preparedness and public health issues, caregiver and patient engagement, drug development, insurance coverage, and biomedical research.
